The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper, or Communion, is one of the two sacraments we celebrate (the other is baptism). It is one of the most important things we do when we gather together, because the bread and juice are concrete signs of what Jesus has done for us on the cross. When we come forward to receive them, we believe that Jesus is actually present through the Holy Spirit, extending his grace and forgiveness to us.

We welcome all baptized Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation. If you are not able to receive Communion, we invite you to use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers:

Prayer of Those Searching for Truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the Way, the Truth and the Life. Help me to be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Lead me into the light and life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am more blind and sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete acceptance. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

We pray for persons in financial need in metropolitan Richmond: for the unemployed and underemployed, for suitable work, living wages and fair benefits for all workers in this metropolitan city and for sufficient employment to make healthy family life possible.

For Our Nation and the World – The United States

With the exception of the Native Americans, the U.S. has been a country of immigrants throughout its history. Currently 176 languages are spoken. Although Christians comprise the largest religious group, the fastest growing religion in the U.S. is "no religious affiliation."

- Christianity shaped the foundation of U.S. government and society, which value democracy, religious freedom, human rights, and generous giving. These values are threatened by the influence of wealth, pornography, drugs, violence, self-centered individualism, and insensitivity to the poor. Ask God to pour out His spirit upon this nation, bringing renewal of faith in Christ and to restore trusting obedience to His will.
- Many racial and ethnic communities continue to face discrimination and the cycles of unemployment, poverty, educational challenges, family instability, and violence. Pray that the church will be at the forefront of honest conversation, building relationships and work to promote opportunity, justice and healing within and between communities.
- Many of the world's unreached people groups are living in the U.S. as immigrants or international students. Many face challenging adjustment issues, lack language and educational skills to get good jobs, and may feel unwelcome or ignored by this host culture. Pray that God's people will be a witness to the love, hope and good news of Jesus.
- Pray for this week's elections. Ask that the Lord will raise up wise and godly men and women to serve our nation, state and local communities. May He bring healing to the deep divisions among us. In 1 Timothy 1, Paul instructs us to pray for all those in authority, which pleases God.

Faith Commitment Sunday




