



Today, our Covenant Partners are committing themselves and their resources to God's work in and through our church.

If you didn't bring your card today, or haven't yet decided on your commitment, it's not too late! Bring your card to the service next week, mail it to the church office, or make your commitment online at thirdrva.org/give.

In years past we have had a stewardship season every fall when we shared our projected budget for the coming year and invited your faith commitment. Your Session has decided it would better serve our church to change the timing of this season, and we will now share the new budget with you after the previous year's books have closed. This has enabled us to project more accurately what our revenue and expenses will be for the coming year and then invite you to join us in giving to this budget through annual commitments.

The Session has set our expense budget for 2022 at \$3,801,500 (breakdowns shown in the chart to the left). This is lower than our 2021 budget, but still represents a \$138K increase over our giving last year, so we are trusting God to provide for this increase.

We encourage you to make a commitment to the Lord for your giving for the year, believing that it's an important and formational exercise in your relationship of following Jesus. By passing along your giving commitment to Third, you'll allow us to provide you updates on your progress toward that commitment throughout the year.
