### LETTER FROM COREY

On behalf of the Session and the Strategic Planning Committee, I want to say thank you for engaging in our vision month in January. You listened, prayed, asked wonderful questions, attended Q+A meetings and working group sessions, offered ideas, and dialogued with one another about the exciting things that lie ahead. I am so excited about what God is doing among us and how we can participate together in this work.

To summarize what we covered in January:

- On January 8, we focused on "Renewing the Person." That Sunday we communicated about our plans to re-organize our Session to shepherd people at Third more effectively into personal transformation.
- On January 15, we focused on "Renewing the Church." That Sunday we communicated about our plans to restructure the congregation into geographic parishes to facilitate community, discipleship and mission.
- On January 22, we focused on "Renewing the City." That Sunday we communicated about our process for adapting and upgrading our facility and campus in a way that contributes to the flourishing of our neighborhood.
- On January 29, we focused on "Renewing All Things." That Sunday we communicated about our plans to work more closely with the Christian Arabic Church, to begin exploring a new Fellows Program and to bring on a new church planting resident.

That was a whole lot to take in! And there is still much work to be done—the strategic planning process is far from over. I encourage you toward the following as we continue moving forward together:




#### SAVE THE DATE: SPORTS SKILLS CAMP
