On Palm Sunday, Corey continued our series in Luke by preaching on the triumphal entry.

## READ

Luke 19:28-44

## REFLECT

1. Last August, we talked a great deal about how in Luke 8-9, Jesus was beginning to turn toward Jerusalem and prepare for Holy Week. All of the stories and text we've covered since then have been stories of Jesus while He was en route to Jerusalem. How does this vector inform your understanding of some of the parables and accounts in the Gospel of Luke?
2. Corey described the symbols of royalty in the parade coming into the city and outlined the Jewish anticipation of a King from the line of David. How does Jesus' entry into Jerusalem connect to the overall narrative of Scripture?
3. Corey pointed out that we often focus on Jesus as "Savior, friend, shepherd, and comforter" but forgetting to treat Him as King. What significance does Christ as King - as He demonstrated on Palm Sunday - have on your life and your relationship with Him?

## PRAY

- + Confess how often we hold up our own desires, our own individual monarchs instead of allowing Christ His rightful place as King.
- + Thank God for answering the prophecies of the Old Testament and entering into Jerusalem in the form of Christ.
- + Ask Jesus to continue establishing Shalom and renewal in the world around us.
- + Pray for spiritual renewal and revival in our community.

## PRACTICE

- + Corey alluded to the great Dylan song "You've gotta serve somebody" as illustrative of the paradigm all those in Jerusalem were confronted with by Jesus' powerful entry. Are you serving Christ or are you getting caught up and serving alternative Kings? How so?
- + What aspects of your life can Jesus bring His Reign of Peace to? How might submitting to Jesus calm you like the colt or awaken you like the stones?
- + This week, what tangible steps or practices can you incorporate to allow Jesus entry into your life? Will you open up and surrender your weakness and vulnerability? Will you allow the true King to reign in your life in preparation for Easter? Work with your group to develop a plan to recognize Christ's kingship in your life.
