We're glad you've chosen to worship at Third! We look forward to meeting and getting to know you.

Third Church exists to spread the gospel and seek the Shalom of metro Richmond and the world through a movement of communities and congregations, welcoming people of all cultures to the glory of Jesus Christ. **Advent** is a word that means "coming" or "arrival." Advent is a four-week period in which the church looks back to remember the fulfilled promises of Jesus' first coming, and looks forward to his promise to come again. Just as John the Baptist told the Jewish people to prepare for the Lord's coming, we gather to encourage each other to be ready for his coming again. The purple color of Advent is the color of royalty, reminding us of the coming King.

Sanctuary Decorations

The purple Advent banners and other decorations now adorning our Sanctuary are the first installment of a year-long effort to use colors and textures to enrich our space and experience of worship, but also to serve as visual clues that, as Christians, we "tell time differently" with a calendar shaped by the story of God's works of salvation and renewal. Tied closely with our Advent sermon series imagery, banners made from ribbons remind us of the "broken beauty" of the Kingdom as Isaiah saw it and we see it now, too: the way we can rejoice in the signs of new creation while acknowledging that many signs of hope still seem fractured, dim, and obscured by the present world.

We'll continue to use that motif (and construction technique) for the next several seasons, changing from Advent purple to Christmas white and gold before our services on Christmas Eve. At that time, we'll also replace the dry, brown wreath and window decorations with the hopeful and familiar evergreen ones, including a "Chrismon" tree that represents the many names and symbols for Jesus. Those will stay through Epiphany in mid-January.

The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper, or Communion, is one of the two sacraments we celebrate (the other is baptism). It is one of the most important things we do when we gather together, because the bread and juice are concrete signs of what Jesus has done for us on the cross. When we come forward to receive them, we believe that Jesus is actually present through the Holy Spirit, extending his grace and forgiveness to us.

We welcome anyone to the table who is willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation. If you are not able to receive Communion, we invite you to use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers:

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the Way, the Truth and the Life. Help me to be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Lead me into the light and life you promise. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am more blind and sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete acceptance. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

For Our Nation and the World – Myanmar

Myanmar (formerly Burma) has been called a "hermit kingdom," because its repressive ruling junta worked for decades to avoid international scrutiny of its rampant human rights violations, hoarding of riches, and widespread economic failures. In 2010, a democracy was installed, bringing a season of halting economic and political opening.

- Buddhism claims 80% of the population. Christians comprise 9%, with the majority of believers coming from limited ethnic minority groups. Pray for perseverance for the church, which is growing in the face of great suffering and repression.
- Myanmar's curse is division and conflict among its 142 ethnic groups, which has caused centuries of strife. The world's most longstanding civil war is happening today between the government and the Karen people. Pray for cessation of violence and the peace of Christ to permeate the hearts of the Myanmar people.
- Discrimination by Buddhists against Muslims is systemic, particularly in the border state of Rakhine. There, Muslim citizens are displaced into inhumane migrant camps, and denied the rights and services that others receive. Pray for religious freedom to become a valued foundation and practice in this fledgling democracy.




