Beginning Anew

Dear Third Family,

I remember when our fourth daughter was born. On the one hand, everything seemed very familiar: the same hospital, the same OB-GYN, the same routine, the same crib, the same car seat, even the same gender! We had done this three times already! But on the other hand, everything was new. A whole new girl, a whole new person, a whole new life. There was something exhilarating in returning to something that was so familiar yet at the same time altogether new.

This December, we are beginning anew in a couple different ways. First of all, we are beginning a new Christian year. The first Sunday of Advent is November 29, and for the historic and global Christian community, Advent begins the new year. We begin rehearsing the same old story again, beginning with the anticipation of Christ (Advent), the coming of Christ (Christmas), the life of Christ (Epiphany), the suffering of Christ (Lent), the resurrection of Christ (Easter), the ascension of Christ (Ascension Day), and the sending of the Spirit (Pentecost). We have rehearsed this story so many times before, yet this is the story that centers our community and anchors our hope. And so even though we have gone through the motions of Advent many times before, we begin this story anew! We move into the season of anticipation remembering that "the hopes and fears of all the years" are met in this One who comes to save.

In December we are also beginning a new sermon series on the Gospel of Luke. Over a period of about eighteen months, with several breaks throughout, we will be working through the entire book of Luke together. For many of us, this will be full of familiar stories that we have heard again and again. So why are we doing this?



There are still 795 million people who are chronically malnourished. One in nine go to bed hungry and 45% of child deaths are attributed to poor nutrition. Now in our 5th year participating in Stop Hunger Now, we are making an impact. The number of those who are malnourished has gone down, 216 million less than 20 years ago.

SMALL GROUP STORY

Grace and Love in a Time of Need

Moving to a new city can be, and most often is, incredibly stressful. This was certainly true for our family, when we moved from the DC area to Richmond in Fall 2014 to be closer to my parents. The circumstances for the move were less than ideal: in late June of 2014, my dad was diagnosed with ALS. We made the decision to move closer to



support family, yet we were immediately subjected to trials of our own, making for one of the most intense years of our lives.

In the midst of this, we quickly found authentic friendship and support through our Third Church small group. Without a doubt, they played a huge role in helping us survive the hardships over the past year. Though we had only known them a short time, we were able to freely and honestly share. The group shared both in the sorrow of trials and in the joy of newfound friendships. They provided meals for us, prayed for us, and have walked the journey with us.

Our small group provided instant community in our time of need; for that we will be forever grateful to God and to Third Church.

MISSIONS PROFILES: Scott & Karen Hanson

In an effort to share the stories and testimonies of Third's missions partners and missionaries, we will more regularly be featuring profiles directly from the field. We hope you are inspired, challenged, and encouraged by the stories of God's faithfulness and favor as his people share the gospel with unreached populations across the globe.

Scott and Karen Hanson are missionaries living and working in Africa with the organization *Live Dead* – a group devoted to the idea that we die to our selves, and live through Christ in us. *Live Dead* is committed to taking the church where it does not yet exist.

Currently, there are over 3.6 billion unreached people in the world, and Live Dead has 40 teams of missionaries targeting five regions in the world. The Hansons labor to plant churches and make disciples of the 867 unreached people groups of the 48 countries in sub-Saharan Africa. Most people in this area couldn't find out about Jesus even if they wanted to! They do not have access to the gospel, church, or other Christians.

Third has sponsored the Hansons since the late 1990's when they were introduced to us through church members. They send regular monthly updates through their newsletter called the "Hanson Heartbeat." October's letter included a wonderful, encouraging story 10 years in the making...

In 2005 they partnered with one of their supporting churches to buy a plot on the Swahili Coast with the intent of building a nursery and eventually planting a church. As building began, villagers became agitated over the idea of a church there and one day a mob with sledgehammers came, chased the workers away and tore down the walls. They made threats to anyone who would try to build there. A true, low moment.

Over the years, attempts to re-engage the village were met with resistance. Last year, however, they decided to try again, this time working through the *Live Dead* business. It purchased the plot from the national church and made plans to build a center. Distrust was still high until the Minister of Education stopped by and talked about how their business is the best English school around and would be a huge blessing to the community. His words broke through, and people's attitudes began to change.

For the past 10 months construction has continued and today the building is almost complete. They have team members ready to move into the community and will begin to make relationships and share the gospel. It is their goal to start a house church and in doing so, share the opportunity to know Christ with many people.

How can you help from right here in Richmond? Pray! They have a program called *Pray Band*, which is a simple network that organizes and multiplies prayer. Pray Bands are established with three people. Each cell is assigned one *Live Dead* church planting team and three unreached people groups in that team's country.




GALLERY 500

GERTRUDE'S NOTRE MAISON ORPHANAGE FUNDRAISER

The Mosaic Ministry thanks the Third Family for its unbelievable generosity this year in starting a nutrition program at Gertrude's Notre Maison Orphanage in Port-au-Prince, Haiti.

This summer, a team from Third held a Vacation Bible School at Notre Maison, an orphanage for 50 children with special needs. In June, Third's men donated the funds raised at the Sam Jackson Memorial Golf Charity Outing to the nutrition initiative. Then, in August, a Mosaic Ministry fundraising dinner raised even more gifts. Between the two events, a total of **\$17,850** was raised for these children!

The children were previously eating flour-based porridge twice a day and one meal of rice and bean sauce. With your contributions, they are now eating eggs, oatmeal, fruits and vegetables. A portion of the money Third raised is going to buy equipment and seeds, and hire labor to develop a sustainable vegetable garden for the orphanage.
