Launching this January at Third Church

LETTER FROM COREY

Dear Third Church family,

In August of 2015, a group of about 30 of us met in a home in the West End to talk about a different vision for community life at Third Church. We wondered: What would happen if we re-organized our church around geographic-based community? Could we deepen our experience of authentic Christian relationships? Could this help us grow as disciples? Could we more effectively reach our neighbors and neighborhoods with the love of Christ? Could this work at Third?

We decided to go for it. We pulled together a group of willing "guinea pigs" to give an early pilot version of "Parish Groups" a try. That early pilot group multiplied into four more pilot Parish Groups. We began to see that yes, this model could indeed work to build community, deepen discipleship, and extend the mission of Jesus. But it took two more years of readjusting, planning and preparing. It took us two more years of getting some things right and a lot of things wrong. It took us two more years to get the right staff in place to make it viable. And it took us two more years of prayer, more prayer, and more prayer on top of that.

So now, more than two years later, we are ready to launch! This January, we are prepared to roll out our vision of Parish Groups to the whole congregation. But before we do that, we wanted to communicate some important lessons we've learned over the past couple years that will hopefully help you prepare your hearts, minds and families for life within a Parish Group.

LESSON 1: Come as you are. Parish Groups are meant to be spiritual families of people following Jesus together in ordinary life. Picture this: you gather together in a living room and a big basket of unfolded laundry sits on the coffee table, and while you talk and pray your host continues to fold. That's a picture of a Parish Group: following Jesus together in ordinary life.

LESSON 2: Everyone gets a part. The best activities are the ones which everyone gets a part and everyone has a voice. Parish Groups are spiritual families in which young and old, families and singles, are all called together through Jesus to a common mission. LESSON 3: Be a Good Neighbor. One of the most important things that makes Parish Groups different than a typical small group is that they exist for the sake of those who are not part of the group- your neighbors! Parish Groups are always asking, How can we better love and serve our neighbors in the name of Jesus? Parish Groups take the simple command of Jesus- to love our neighbors are ourselves—and attempts to practice it literally.

I am so excited that after nearly two years of praying and planning, we are now officially launching "Parish Life" here at Third. Inside, you can find all the details about how to get more information and how to get involved. In the meantime, please pray that God would continue to bless this journey that began more than two years ago and by His grace will continue for many years to come!

At Third, we desire everyone to be known, cared for, and encouraged to mature as disciples of Christ.

In order to do this, we are reclaiming an old—and biblical —vision for how we do church together. This vision impacts how we build community, grow as disciples, and love our neighbors. Through Parish Groups we will provide each person at Third the opportunity for gospel community, intentional discipleship, and localized mission within your neighborhood.

God is inviting us to participate in his grand plan to renew all things. We hope you join us.

Starting this January, we are inviting you to join a Parish Group in your area of Richmond.

WHAT IS A PARISH GROUP?

Simply, a Parish Group is a community of people seeking to follow Jesus together and extend his mission in a specific place. These two elements, community and mission, are the foundation upon which Parish Groups are built. Parish Groups are always open that normally consist of 15-20 adults plus children, or as many people can fit in a home. Parish Groups meet weekly, and follow the Up/In/Out rhythm. Parish Groups offer a social environment in which men, women and children can grow as disciples of Jesus, deepen relationships, and participate in God's mission to renew all things.

And what's the difference between a Parish Group and a Parish Area again?

Parish Areas are just how we've organized the geographic regions around Richmond where our church family lives. These smaller communities, called parish areas, will insure that each person in our church comes to be known more intentionally and intimately because our elders and deacons will be organized across these parish areas. Everyone is in a Parish Area since it only refers to how we've organized the congregation, but you can choose to be a part of a Parish Group—and we strongly encourage you to do so!

HOW CAN I JOIN A PARISH GROUP?

We'll have our official Parish Life Experience in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, January 21 and 28 from 9:30–11:30 a.m., where you can find out which Parish Area you live in and which groups are happening in your area. 
All of the discipleship classes for adults meet at 10 a.m. We invite you to join us and give a discipleship class a try.
