

Lent is a season in which we especially focus on examining our hearts, confessing our sin, and reflecting on the significance of Jesus' death for us. Think of it as sort of "spring cleaning" of the soul. Of course you need to sweep and clean all year round, but you might have a concentrated focus on deep cleaning in different seasons. Alternatively, the Lenten season is the spiritual equivalent of an annual physical exam; it's a time to take stock of our lives, and the spiritual health of our hearts.

It's fitting that throughout the season of Lent we'll continue to look together at the questions Jesus asks. James Ryan writes, "Questions are like keys. The right question, asked at the right time, will open a door to something you don't yet know, something you haven't yet realized, or something you haven't even considered- about others and about yourself." With his questions, Jesus is wielding a spiritual key to open our hearts, bringing us into a deeper awareness of our need for grace and the all-sufficiency of his love.

#### **OUR SERMON SERIES**

Don't just come and listen on Sunday – do something with the message! Set aside some time each week to engage personally and prayerfully with the question of Jesus. Let him ask it to you. And if you missed the sermon, you can still participate. #### A SPIRITUAL RETREAT

Setting aside time for solitude and prayer is a vital way we can listen to God and hear his voice. #### PERSONAL DISCIPLINES

After a great February Term on habits, we've learned the power of spiritual habits to shape our lives. Resolve to work on one new habit this Lent that can help you connect with God in a fresh way. Perhaps mid-day prayer, a weekly fast, a weekly time of solitude, or learning to journal? Try something new and invite God to speak to you freshly.

# **2018 FINANCIAL YEAR REPORT**

Now that we're well into 2019, we want to report to our church family how we ended the 2018 financial year. Because we're stewarding our financial resources in mission together, we are committed to transparency about our budget and finances. Any time you have a question or want to see the budget in detail, please reach out. We have an amazing financial staff who are always happy to answer your questions.

#### **LOOKING BACK**

The general giving budget for 2018 was \$3,796,783. This was a 13.2% increase over our 2017 budget, a stretch we believe was prudent, given strong 2017 giving levels, growing numbers of new covenant partners, and expanded ministry programming. We tracked well with our giving throughout the first half of the year, but anticipated giving was not as consistent in the second part of the year, resulting in our general giving coming in at 4.8% lower than planned, a shortfall of \$187,025.

The good news is that our total general giving for 2018 was still 6% higher than 2017. We are so thankful that our congregation continues to grow both in membership and giving. We also were able to manage our expenses well throughout the year, such that we ended the year with basically a balanced budget – a difference of only \$6,058. We are so grateful to God that we were able to end the year strong, not dip into our reserve funds, or use Third's available line of credit. We can enter 2019 in a stable financial position for a fresh year of ministry!

#### LOOKING AHEAD

In December our Session approved a 2019 budget of \$4,070,655. This proposed budget is a 5% increase over the 2018 budget. However, given that our actual giving was 4.8% lower than the 2018 budget plan, we are concerned about proceeding with a 2019 budget which represents nearly a 10% increase over 2018 actual giving. So in our most recent Session meeting, the elders approved a motion to proceed with the 2019 approved budget but plan to defer spending \$169,857 of that budget until we see pledges and income demonstrating support for expending these costs.

2018 BUDGET: \$3,796,783

2019 BUDGET: \$4,070,655

The \$169,857 includes four distinct expenses: HVAC replacement (\$28,450), extra debt repayment on our principle for our 500 Forest Ave office building (\$28,450), salary increases for staff (\$62,000), and 30% of the total from planned missions spending (\$50,957).

Other than the deferral of planned mission spending, which simply reflects potentially lower general giving levels (since we dedicate 30% of all general giving to missions), Session especially regrets holding back the spending on staff salary increases, which are well deserved. We hope that by the end of the first quarter, we will see pledges and giving that demonstrates support for releasing these deferred expenditures.

#### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Please keep our church in your prayers, including our financial stewardship. Pray that the Lord continues to faithfully provide for all of our needs. If you have not yet made a pledge for 2019 but plan to give this year, please do make a pledge, as it will help us determine if we can include the increases named above. Covenant Partner Dr. Danielle Avula is joining our mission partner CrossOver as a part-time Family Physician at their Henrico Clinic.



#### SILENT ALLELUIA: A LENTEN OBSERVATION

Lent is a 40-day period of preparation and repentance, a time in which we anticipate the joy of Easter and the celebration of Christ's resurrection. Because of the contemplative nature of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days, a practice that goes back to at least the fifth century in the Western church.

This year we'll practice again a period of "silent alleluia," suspending the use of the word alleluia in our worship services from Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday. On Easter Sunday, April 21, the alleluias will return and we will sing and say alleluia with great joy and celebration, including the ringing of bells! We hope this will be a meaningful time of contemplation for our community and a joyous celebration on the first!

# **COMMUNION CLASS**


When: Sunday, March 24, 10:15 a.m.
